### SPEAKER BIOGRAPHIES

#### Faroud Hakim, DDS

Dr. Hakim has balanced private practice and dental education for over 23 years in the San Francisco Bay Area. He has a true passion for restorative dentistry ranging from complex rehabilitation to optimal and conservative single tooth restoration. He is Vice Chair of the Department of Integrated Reconstructive Dental Sciences at University of the Pacific and is a clinic director in the Esthetics, Implant and Complex Care Clinic. Dr. Hakim has lectured nationally and internationally in many venues including seminars, continuums and hands-on workshops on topics ranging from technology, esthetic dentistry, occlusion, smile design, CAD/CAM, photography, and adhesive and composite dentistry. Dr. Hakim has several publications and has authored two chapters in the 2010 text, *Esthetic Dentistry in Clinical Practice* from Blackwell Publishing. Dr. Hakim earned his DDS in 1991 from Pacific and later went on to complete an MBA from his alma mater. He is a member of OKU dental honor society and past president of the Delta Delta Chapter. He is also a fellow and graduate of the ADEA Leadership Institute class of 2007 and is a member of the Catapult Group, the dental industry's premier speaker's bureau.

#### Timothy Betita, DDS

Dr. Betita studied at the University of the Pacific School of Dentistry's accelerated dental program in San Francisco. After obtaining a doctorate of dental surgery, he immediately entered medical school with advanced standing at the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio. He earned a medical degree and remained in San Antonio to complete his oral and maxillofacial residency. During this time, he was trained in a world-class program in general surgery, anesthesiology, neurosurgery, cardiothoracic surgery, and surgical oncology. He also received extensive training in facial trauma, corrective jaw surgery, and TMJ surgery, as well as major bone grafting procedures, and dental implant placement for full-arch restorations.

Dr. Betita's main areas of focus in the practice are extractions, bone grafting, and placement of dental implants. He is also a specialist for both conservative and surgical TMJ treatment. In the local hospitals, he performs surgeries for patients with traumatic injuries.

#### Jacob Barber, DDS

Dr. Jacob Barber is an oral surgeon in private practice in Modesto. Dr. Barber graduated from UOP dental school in 2010 and then the Highland Hospital/UOP Oral Surgery Program in 2014. He is the past CE Chair for the SDS and leads the Young Dentist Study Club of Modesto. Dr. Barber specializes in complex bone augmentation procedures for dental implant rehabilitation. He utilizes the latest techniques for BMP, PRF, and other growth factors to augment bone grafts for better clinical success.
